3. Research, Consultancy and Extension

3.1 Initiatives of the Department in Sensitizing/Promoting Research Climate in the institution

- The IQAC strives hard to imbibe scientific attitude and a research culture on the campus by instructing, recommending and carrying out a number of activities.
- Workshops are organized in various departments on current topics/ trends to gain insight in the said area. A total of three University level workshops and three College level conferences were organized during the current year for the benefit of students and faculty.
- Students are encouraged to present their research work in 'AAVISHKAR' Competition and in National and International conferences to get acquainted with the research scenario.
- Research discussion groups are encouraged in all departments to deliberate on current research topics.
- The students from under-graduate and post-graduate courses are encouraged and supported to participate in the research activities as a part of their syllabi i.e. for dissertation or as a co-curricular activity teaming with staff or research scholars in the ongoing projects.
- The departments have been advised to carry out collaborative work to bridge the gap between industry and academia. A total of, three National (Physics, History and Botany) and four Regional (Sociology, Physics, History, English) collaborations are in place.
- Constant efforts are made to provide environment conducive to research on the college campus by making necessary provisions.
- Each laboratory is provided with modern infrastructure for research. In addition a Central Instrumentation Facility houses state of art instruments like HPLC, FTIR, AAS, etc.
- The college has **Eleven** Recognized Research Centres for Ph.D., **Ten** for M.Phil. and **Thirty** recognized Research Guides.
- The faculty is encouraged to engage in research activities through various major and minor projects from different organizations. Currently there are **four** Major and **eleven** Minor ongoing projects.

- There are **ninety six** students pursuing their Ph.D. in different subjects at present. During this academic year **fourteen** Ph.D. degrees were awarded.
- Students from department of Biotechnology, Computer Science, Physics and Botany have also published their work in reputed national and international journals.
- The college provides resource facilities like Botanical garden, plots for trials and separate computer facility for accessing journals in the library.
- Study tours and visits are organized every semester to industries and research institutes around and outside Nashik to create awareness about the recent developments going on in the field and the career opportunities therein.
- Guest lecturers of eminent scientists are organized for interaction and discussion on various avenues in research field.eg. Dr. Milind Watve Prof. at IISER, Pune was invited to deliver a lecture.
- The research fraternity of the college has maintained an outstanding record of publishing research work in eminent journals. The research activity during this year has enabled the faculty to publish **fifty six** Research Papers in Peer-reviewed International journals in addition to **nineteen** in National Journals, **twenty six** in Conference Proceedings, **four** in e-Journals and **six** in Non-Peer-Reviewed Journals. These activities are very encouraging.

5.6 Details of student counselling and career guidance

➤ Departmental level

- All the faculty members of each department continuously guide students on various issues concerning academics, career guidance, personal and family issues in informal and formal way at their level. However, considering the large number of student strength the College also arranges certain activities wherein group counselling is given to the students.

➤ Coaching in English

- In the present year a special guidance programme was designed and organized for the students of First year. The weak students were identified; they demanded extra coaching in English subject. - Department of Electronic Science implements smart board and document camera for teaching learning. It conducts SPEED (Society for Promotion of Excellence in Electronics Discipline) and bi-weekly *Runanubandha* wallpaper.

6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

- As per University guidelines, college conducts continuous assessment process for examination and evaluation.
- As per the credit-based evaluation system for PG students, we conduct variety of descriptive and objective tests, OBTs, assignments, review of research papers, open-book tests and seminars.

6.3.4 Research and Development

- The college has **11** Ph. D. and 10 M. Phil. recognized research centres. The necessary resources are made available in all research centers.
- At present in college, **30** faculty members are recognized as Ph.D. research guides under which **96** students have registered and **14** students are awarded Ph.D. degree till date.
- **Four Major** and **Eleven Minor** research projects are ongoing in various departments.
- Management provides financial assistance to the faculty for attending International seminars/ conferences/ workshops abroad.
- The College has academic linkages with 3 national level organisations and the University level.

INNOVATIVE PRACTICES

1) Friendship Day

Context:

Celebrating days is a mark of the youth and also one major cause of criticism. However their fervor for celebration can be properly channelized to give a new direction to their thinking. It was with this view that the Dept. of English started Friendship Day celebration in the department

Aims:

1. To blend enjoyment with broader educational context
2. To appreciate their need for change in academic atmosphere
3. To give more constructive direction to their celebrations by developing new attitudes in them

PRACTICE

This was the third year of Friendship Day Celebration in the dept. the students were excited at the idea of celebrating Friendship Day with a difference. The idea was discussed with them and they suggested that the first Departmental Friendship Day will be celebrated as Friendship with English Day. The next two years it was celebrated as Friendship with Environment and Friendship with Books Day. Students prepared Friendship Bands, posters, cards on the respective theme and distributed them on campus randomly. They wrote some of the messages on the cards themselves and collected quotes. They gave speeches and took oaths on the themes. On the occasion of Friendship with Books Day they gave a few books, new and old to the departmental library and borrowed some from the main library for reading.

OUTPUT

- a. More participatory decision making encouraged
- b. More awareness about particular theme
- c. Opportunity to try out other skills like making cards and bands along with communication skills could be tried out
Innovative thinking encouraged
- d. Better rapport with the faculty
- e. Knowledge about the need to play an active role for change-in oneself or other-in values or behaviour

Difficulties Encountered

Luckily there were no difficulties encountered. The students were eager for new ways and ideas as they were drawn from them.

2) Best Reader of the Year Award

Context

This was a regular practice in the department of English which for some reasons discontinued for a few years. The Department also had a book club. But with growing influence of social media and convergence the reading habits were adversely affected. With the departmental library and place for students to sit there faculty of the department decided to restart the old practice and announced Best Reader of the Year Award.

Objectives

- a. To promote reading habits
- b. To make books of good literary values available
- c. To encourage students write and speak about books read
- d. To enable discussions in groups on books
- e. To create healthy competition among students in the Department

PRACTICE

Students borrow books from Departmental Library; read it closely and write their comments on it. By checking library records, reading students' writing about the books read and through interaction one student is given a book as prize on the Farewell party towards the end of the year.

OUTPUT

Reading habits are inculcated among students
Students have started discussing books formally and informally
This habit has brought about a positive change in their writing skills and expression
More and better reading has started occurring
Students are able to understand the importance of reading to develop language, expression as well as thoughts

Difficulties Encountered

There were actually no difficulties as such though the no. of literary texts has to be limited in the departmental library as it also has research section. However all members of the faculty give books to students from their personal collection. The department has also started collecting e books and films based on literary pieces.

Innovative practices of the other departments are enlisted as follows-

Zoology -Use of video clipping for teaching.

Sociology- Use of film shows, outreach programmes and sensitizing activities to widen social context.

Statistics- Student presented paper in national and international conferences.

Political Science- Giving real life political experience about functioning of Gramsabha and Grampanchayat through visits and to create awareness about voting.

Physics- Training the students for effective presentations using ICT.

Microbiology- Donation of books by past students

Mathematics - A good use of e-resources

- More than 350 e-books were made available on each of the PC in Computer laboratory
- Video lectures: History of Mathematics, Fermat's Last Theorem, Mobius Band, Introduction to Topology, Linear Algebra.
- Mathematica, Mathmodelica and CASIO-fx-cg-82 software are in use.
- Software Demonstrations given: Integral Curves Solver, Complex Function Drawer.

Marathi –

- Debating and Reading Club is established.
- Elocution & Debate Competition are conducted for overall development of students.

History –

- Modi Script teaching has created a great deal of awareness and also increased employability of the students. Now our students are able to read rare historical documents.
- Students are enabled to conduct sessions of Modi and Pali scripts.

Hindi – ‘Hindi main bolo abhiyaan’ to promote use of Hindi.

- “Chatur Chatura” personality development competition in Hindi.

Geography –

- Whether Station reports are displayed every morning on the college notice board

Electronic Science–

- The department conducts SPEED (Society for Promotion and Excellence in Electronics Discipline) quiz competition
- The department conducts “Runanubandh” bi-weekly wallpaper activity and quiz competition

Economics- Home budgeting exercise for the benefit of the students

Computer Science –

- Departmental Administration is decentralized
- Conduct of mock interviews and aptitude tests for PG students is a regular practice

Commerce – Students encouraged to Survey Market for hand on experience

Chemistry – Projects undertaken to relate Chemistry to everyday life

Biotechnology –

- Workshops like CODONICS, Nanotechnology and Bioinformatics were taken under the star college scheme. The activity was conducted for all Life sciences departments.
- Practical modules apart from the syllabus were taken for TY students.

Environment Science-

- Pollution Free River campaign and 'Go Green' research initiatives

Biotechnology-

- It has a practice of Science Day Exhibition –Models related to scientific concepts are prepared by students and displayed

Remedial teaching

Slow learners are identified at entry level. Remedial teaching and intensive coaching is offered to these students who need extra and special attention. Enrichment courses like personality development programme and English speaking courses are conducted to improve students' personality.

Maximum use of Earn and Learn Scheme

- The college has large number of students and especially girls working under the scheme.
- There is no bar on the number.
- Under demand driven basis any needy student can get the opportunity.
- This year **304** students are benefited by the scheme.

Internal Academic Check Up/Audit

- All the teaching staff members submitted annual plan for conduct of academic and non academic their respective head of departments.
- Monthly reports are collected from the teaching staff where in teachers give information regarding coverage of syllabus during that particular month. In case where syllabus was not covered as per schedule, the teachers were accordingly advised to take adequate steps. At the end of the academic term respective heads of departments and the Principal examine whether the entire syllabus has been completed as per the initial planning and appropriate steps are initiated. The main academic and semi-academic activities are also noted in the report.
- Along with the monthly report academic diary is maintained by faculty. It is monitored by Head of the departments and the Principal.
- This is done in both formal and informal way.

Perspective Plan of the College

A) Academic Best Practices

1) Continuous evaluation

Context:

- When a topic is revised immediately after learning it formally it converts into long time memory.

Aim:

- Keeping students academically engaged and involved
- To seek feedback to know understanding level.
- Creating opportunities for independent thinking and expression by means of setting a variety of questions.
- Giving them practice of writing precise answers in their own way
- Giving them practice in writing and oral skills
- Enabling them manage exam stress
- Helping them manage time in exam hall

Practice:

- Regular written/oral tests of various types like MCQ, open book tests, short answer, broad answer questions, etc are conducted.
- The assessed answer papers are given to the students for perusal. Their queries are responded and counseling is done.
- Quiz, seminars, group discussions, projects, surprise tests, field observations and exercises are other ways of students' learning

Outcome:

- Students are benefitted in annual examinations.
- It keeps students academically engaged and involved.
- It helps in academic development of students.

2) Collection of e books

Context:

- This practice is specially meant for PG and research Students.
- A large number of books in e form are collected on the specialized research areas.

Aim

- To make wide range of 'must read' books available to students
- To make all those books available to students which are either not in form of hard copies or are too costly to purchase

- To give proper direction to the learning habits of students
- Help them make proper choice of books

Output:

- Need of the students related with reading is taken care of
- A positive use of internet facility provided to every department
- Valuable books are readily available to research students
- Adds value to their thought process and expression

B) Value Addition based Best Practices

Context:

One of the aims of education is to sensitize students to social issues and make them ready to play their role in the general good of the society. This is done by imparting social values in them and exposing them to social realities through firsthand experience. The awareness of the problems experienced on field has long reaching effects. The knowledge of life beyond one's comfort zone also helps relate with the others. This kind of sensitization makes the personality complete enabling a society with learned activists.

Aims:

1. Helping students both comprehend and apply theories.
2. Thereby bridging the so called gap between the two.
3. Creating opportunities for students to participate in social awareness programmes.
4. Taking them to visits to rural areas, urban slums, old people's homes, homes for the destitute.
5. Arranging awareness camps/workshops.
6. Encouraging them to participate in various social welfare pursuits.

PRACTICE

Activities like Bal Sanskar Varga (Value Education classes) run by students in the slum area, students doing internships in homes for the destitute, their participation in campaigns for popularization of science, in Pollution Free River campaign, in 'Go Green' initiatives in Trambakeshwar and Pandharpur VARI, as well as participation in Road Safety drive are all examples of the best practices that inculcate values like good citizenship, self discipline, protection of environment, understanding others. Some of them also think more creatively to offer options for existing practices. The College takes up these activities through various departments and committees of the college every year. The scope and area vary; expand or change but the essential message of helping others to help one's own life fruitful is conveyed effectively to students

OUTPUT

1. The practice of the few becomes thought of many who we look at as would be practitioners.
2. Those who participate in the activities develop a new attitude towards participatory societal change.
3. They understand that real education lies in actually using knowledge also for others.

4. They take up varied voluntary campus surveys ranging from addiction to use of mobile and social media.
5. They change their role from passive to active.
6. Such activities when discussed in the classroom motivate others.
7. Most students practice saving energy and make it a point to switch off all electric gazettes before leaving class rooms/labs so as to avoid wastage of energy.
8. This becomes exemplary to others.

Difficulties Encountered

1. Changing the mind- set of students is a real task.
2. Changing their age old notion about exam-oriented education.
3. Bringing them out from their inertia.

The minimal wastage is drained after reasonable treatment so as to make it non hazardous.

***e-waste management**

Non-working computers, monitors and printers are discarded and scrapped on a systematic basis. If some parts are useful, in other systems they are kept aside for future use.

- The Placement Cell regularly arranges campus interviews in collaboration with corporate organizations and industries.
- Competitive examination centre with a library.
- Four Auditoriums and VLC hall cater to various extra and co curricular needs.
- Computer systems with broadband connectivity are made available to every department.
- Extended intercom system enables easy communication
- Several extra-curricular activities are organized to enhance all-round development of the students.
- Effective outreach programmes are conducted by some departments.
- Practice of preparing question banks by the students in the classroom is a unique feature.

Threats:

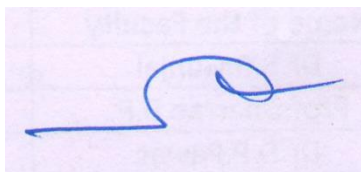
- Number of working students is increasing. It is adversely affecting the attendance. This puts limits on face to face interaction between teachers and students.

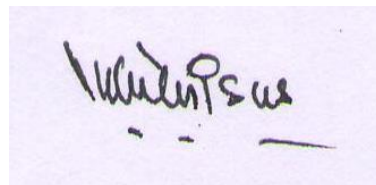
